**Haiti Earthquake Relief and Recovery
Your Help is Needed!**

The devastation took just moments; the recovery will take years. Your help is urgently needed to enable survivors of this tragedy to fend off hunger and disease and to rebuilt their lives.

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, American Baptists began responding immediately. Nearly \$40,000 has been sent so far for relief efforts underway in Port-au-Prince and the surrounding area. Baby & Hygiene Kits for Haiti

Our Sunday School children are assembling Baby and Hygiene kits to send to Haiti through Church World Service. We're beginning this Sunday, Jan. 24.

For Baby Kits we need: * Six cloth diapers

- * Two T-shirts or undershirts (no onesies)
- * Two washcloths
- * Two gowns or sleepers
- * Two diaper pins
- * One sweater or sweatshirt
- * Two receiving blankets (one can be a hand-knitted or crocheted baby blanket)

For Hygiene Kits we need: * One hand towel measuring about 16" x 28" (no fingertip or bath towels)

- * One washcloth
- * One wide-tooth comb
- * One nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards)
- * One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- * One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- * Six Band-Aids®
